Theme

Over the last ten to twenty years, historians and social scientists have again studied the history of the First World War intensively. In the historiographies of the West European countries (both former victors and defeated nations) there has been a noticeable shift from military and diplomacy history to alternative aspects such as wartime experiences, war crimes and cultures of violence, propaganda and images preparing citizens for war, the consequences for society and the state as well as the cultural memories. Overall, the war has become more of a state of extreme tension for individuals, societies and states.

In historical studies of Southeast Europe, this paradigm shift has hardly been implemented so far. The reorganization and reorientation of the relevant scientific disciplines after the end of communist rule has also indeed favoured historical perspectives focussing on human experiences. Nevertheless, more often than not conventional military and political history continues to dominate the field of war studies, while cultural and socio-historical dimensions are being ignored. Conversely, the unspoken assumption that war and violence constituted less of an exceptional situation for the Balkans figures into this state of affairs, too. On the triadic reading of war as historic event, experience and memory, this year's Hochschulwoche commemorates the centenary of the Sarajevo murders by taking stock of recent research on the war decade from 1908 to 1918. On the other hand, the conference features a comparative perspective that includes the latest insights and approaches of recent European studies on the First World War II.
